

Student Admissions, Outcomes, and Other Data

APPLICANT SELECTION

Admission to the Clinical Psychology Graduate Program is competitive and based on wide-ranging criteria, most importantly, undergraduate GPA (3.0 minimum), Verbal and Quantitative GRE scores, research experience, and letters of recommendation. Additionally, relevant clinical and teaching experiences will be considered. For applicants who have attended a master's program, graduate GPA and experiences will also be considered. We look for students whose interests come close to our training objectives and whose research interests match those of the faculty. A student entering the program should have completed at least 18 hours of psychology, including a class in statistics. The Clinical Psychology Graduate Program enrolls approximately 6-8 students per year from an application pool of approximately 180-200 applicants.
